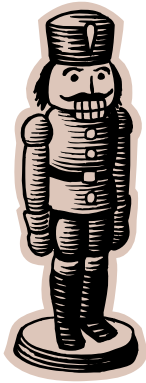

Suggestions for Eco-Friendly Holiday Celebrations:

- Buy locally grown produce. This supports local farmers and reduces emissions from transport trucks that deliver the produce
 - Avoid using paper plates or other disposable dinnerware.
 - Save water by scraping dishes instead of rinsing them before they go in the dishwasher. As long as you do not overload the machine and you position the dirty dishes according to the manufacturer's instructions, your dishwasher actually uses less water than if you hand-washed your dishes.
- Before you make that trip 'over the hill and through the woods to Grandma's house', make sure your car tires are properly inflated - saves you money by increasing your mileage
 - Whenever possible, fly non-stop. The average domestic flight uses about 100 gallons of gas per passenger. One less flight means less damage to the environment.
 - Shop over the internet. Fierce competition for Christmas business means better service and free shipping from online retailers.
