Public Issues Community Service Program By Beth Jetha

Feb. 1-7, 2015 is Burn Awareness Week. Eighty percent of burns occur at home. Please take steps to make your house a safe environment and prevent burning or scalding. Set the water heater to a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit. It will be hot enough to wash clothes and dishes but will not burn you. Practice safe kitchen habits to prevent scalding accidents—keep children away from stoves, ovens and electric appliances, keep hot drinks or food from the edge of tables, move sauce pan handles away from the edge of the stove, and use insulated pot-holders, not towels, to handle hot saucepans.

Last year, the Public Issues Community Service Program committee donated more than \$6,000 in Atlanta Woman's Club funds to various organizations to promote

and support social justice, civic service, and our military families. We had club members who volunteered on Voter Registration Day and a polling station on Election Day. We are all very proud of the volunteer hours contributed by members to the Georgia Justice Project. AWC members served more than 300 volunteer hours to the GJP last year.

Nominations may be given to any of the Nominating Committee, listed below. We must present the slate at the March 9 general meeting, as well as post it in the Club and publish it in the newsletter prior, so please make your nominations as soon as possible.

Here are some FAQ about the process and requirements for the BOT position:

Who can be nominated?

A candidate for the Board of Trustees shall have been a member of the club for at least one year with regular attendance (Article VII Section 2).

Do I need to get permission from someone before I nominate her?

Once a name has been given to the committee, a member of the committee will contact the candidate to discuss the duties of the office with her. Nominees will then complete a form confirming their willingness to serve if elected.

What if I nominate someone and her name does not appear on the slate?

If someone is nominated and her name does not appear on the slate it is either because she chose not to serve or did not meet all of the qualifications.

Can members of the Nominating Committee be nominated?

Yes, but they must remove themselves from discussion of their candidacy.

Can an officer of the club run for another office?

Yes, but if elected to another office that officer must resign her position before assuming the new position (Article V Section 2 "No officer may serve in two elected positions at the same time").

Will nominations be taken from the floor?

Yes, however the Nominating Committee requests that you provide that name to the committee prior to the election so that we can verify the qualifications of the candidate. The name will remain confidential until nominated from the floor.

Can any member of AWC nominate someone?

Yes.
