MLK, Jr. World Peace Rose Garden:

Conservation celebrated the 25th Anniversary of the Martin Luther King, Jr. "I Have a Dream" World Peace Rose Garden On May 10 and 11. AWC member volunteers attended a dinner reception Wednesday evening at the MLK Visitor Center and then lent a hand at an Award Ceremony in the Garden and the old Ebenezer Baptist Church on Thursday. T.J. David and Sylvia Villalobos Co-Creators of the International World Peace Rose Gardens coordinated the celebration with Rebecca Karcher, Chief of Education and Cultural Resources for the National Park Service which administers the Garden. Guest speakers were Martin Luther King III and Andrea Waters King. Each year an annual contest is held and children from local, national, and global schools submit poems of peace inspired by the memory and messages of MLK, Jr. The 2017 celebration recognized the 30 winners whose poems are now displayed on plaques in the Garden. There were 12,322 entries and 160 finalists who submitted poems from China, India, Mexico, Gaza, California, Washington DC and Atlanta. A special delegation of Chinese students also came over for the celebration. There were 20 finalists and 3 winners selected from China's 9000 entries. Special guests Sandy Huber and Poet Laureate Tama Brisbane attended from Stockton California where a new International World Peace Rose Garden is being developed. The Garden is one of five major World Peace Rose Gardens established around the world at cultural, historical and sacred centers of the world. The Garden is has been a successful multi-year project of Conservation CSP coordinated by Penny Blackford and supported by group of regular volunteer "MLK Garden Angels" who snip the roses and help maintain the Garden on a regular basis to keep it looking its best. T.J. and Sylvia recognized the work of AWC's volunteers at the festivities with special awards. A winning poem and pictures from the event are below. The roses are thriving and AWC volunteers are needed now for the 2017 Garden growing season. Snipping happens on Saturday mornings in the Garden. Please contact Penny Blackford to volunteer.
