Billie Harris was born and raised in Woodville, MS. She grew up helping her Grandmother run their family grocery store. She worked along side her Grandmother until she graduated high school in 1998. That year, when her Grandmother passed, Arbuthnot's Grocery closed its doors after serving the community for 53 years. She then accepted a full academic scholarship to Tuskegee University where she majored in Architecture and minored in English.

After studying at Tuskegee for 2yrs, she decided to venture into a new major as well as a new school. She then transferred to the Art Institute of Atlanta where she majored in Multimedia and Graphic Design, and finished with a Bachelor of Fine Arts. Billie began working for ConAlliance Inc., a technology consulting firm, as an Information Tech from 2006-2009. After the company dissolved, Billie began working for Delta Airlines as a Customer Service Associate in May 2009. During that time she began to volunteer at charitable organizations. The first was Hands on Atlanta, as an academic tutor for elementary school children with Sickle Cell Anemia who missed time away from school. She also worked with Hosea Feed the Hungry Foundation during the holiday seasons.

While working at Delta, she met her husband, Flavius, and was married April 3rd, 2010. At that time Billie became the mother of 4, 3 sons and 1 daughter. Billie loved helping others and found herself dedicating more and more time to her volunteer work. With a suggestion from her husband that she pursue her passion rather than her occupation, she resigned from Delta to become an Event Coordinator and Philanthropist. Billie has organized several clothing, toy, and food drives over the past 4 years and donated her collections to such organizations as the Atlanta Community Food Bank, Atlanta Children's Shelter, Toys for Tots, and Coats for Kids to name a few.

In 2010, she also independently formed What's The Plan, LLC, an event planning company.
