



The house was build in 1906, but the Woman's Club had already been around for a while at that time.

The House was designed by noted Atlanta architect **W. T. Downing**, who also designed The Basilica of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, Lupton Hall at Oglethorpe University, and many, many other Atlanta landmarks.



The Woman's Club sprung forth from a meeting during The Cotton States and International Exposition and was formed later the same year—1895!




The Wimbish House tour
