Arts and Culture had a busy April donating well-deserved money to some wonderful 501 (c)(3) organizations!





BYLAW COMMITTEE

The AWC Bylaw Committee is proposing the following amendments to the bylaws.

1. The amendment addresses the composition of the Board. We are adding a requirement that past Board of Trustees chair serve a full term as chair to remain on board (new wording in bold)

Article V1- Board of Trustees

Section 1. Composition

The Board of Trustees shall consist of four (4) elected trustees, the Club President, the first vice president, treasurer and assistant treasurer, past Board of Trustees chairs in good standing **who have served a full term as chair**, and the parliamentarian or parliamentary advisor, who serves but has no right to vote. Two (2) trustees shall be elected on odd-numbered years and two (2) trustees shall be elected in even-numbered years. Elected members serve for a term of (2) years.

2. The second amendments adds a new section 3 on term limits for the elected trustees in line with the term limits we have for club officers

Section 3 Term of Office

Officers of the Board shall serve for (2) years or until their successors are elected. Elected trustees may serve only (2) consecutive terms. The number of past BOT chairs serving on the BOT cannot exceed the number <u>of elected and appointed trustee</u> who serve on the BOT. The longest serving past BOT chair will automatically rotate off of the BOT if this occurs.
